DR. ALFRED A. YEE

The Structural Engineers Association of Hawaii (SEAOH) and the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) Hawaii Chapter mourn the loss of Dr. Alfred A. Yee who passed away in April of this year. His knowledge and expertise in engineering, especially relating to precast, prestressed concrete, was sought around the globe. He received numerous accolades and honors for his contributions to his profession. Dr. Yee was a highly accomplished engineer and inventor.

He graduated from St. Louis School in 1943. He was later inducted into the St. Louis School's Gallery of Distinguished Achievers and also participated on the Board of Trustees. He attained degrees in engineering from Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology and Yale University. Rose-Hulman Institute Technology presented him with an Honorary Doctor of Engineering degree in 1976, for his contributions to concrete technology.

Dr. Yee developed numerous revolutionary construction techniques and structural concepts for precast, prestressed concrete. He was able to overcome major obstacles using simple solutions. Dr. Yee held a number of patents for construction devices and systems. His NMB Splice Sleeve mechanical connector contributed to the seismic resistance of concrete structures in the intense 1995 earthquake in Kobe, Japan; the State of Hawaii Legislature honored him with an Official Proclamation for this invention. In 1955, Dr. Yee also introduced the first precast, prestressed concrete mass production facility in Hawaii; which was also among the first facilities of its kind in the United

Dr. Yee was President of Yee Precast Design Group Ltd and Director of Precast Design Consultants Pte. Limited in Singapore. During his over 65 year career he had the opportunity to work on notable projects throughout the world including the Saudi Arabian Monetary Agency Office Buildings in Riyadh, 100 Washington Square in Minneapolis, and The Sail at Marina Bay development which included 70 and 63 story towers. Many of his projects in Hawaii are iconic and include the IBM Building, Kahala Hotel, Queen Emma Gardens, The Marco Polo, Ala Moana Hotel, and the USS Arizona Memorial. The gracefully curving, 400foot-long, Alapai Street Pedestrian Overpass received the Engineering Excellence Award in 1970 from the Consulting Engineers Council due to its aesthetics.

Some of his projects use concrete in ways that would surprise most people. Dr. Yee was an expert in the design and construction of floating concrete marine vessels such as barges and platforms. These systems provide lower maintenance and superior durability in harsh environments when compared to their traditional counterparts. He designed and provided construction supervision for the world's first oceangoing precast, pretensioned concrete barges in 1964 for the Luzon Stevedoring Company in the Philippines. Another one of his projects was the world's first Concrete Island Drilling System (CIDS) which is a 325-foot square floating platform made of pre-stressed concrete. The CIDS is able to withstand some of the most brutal conditions on earth as it travels through the Arctic Seas off the coast of Alaska. These concrete vessels utilize his patented "honey comb" design which utilizes cylindrical cells to provide buoyancy and strength. Dr. Yee also took part in the design of the Ocean Thermal Energy Conversion (OTEC) facility which is a concrete floating vessel with capabilities to produce fresh water, liquid hydrogen and electricity.

Dr. Yee was deeply involved with the engineering community. He served on the University of Hawaii's College of Engineering Dean's Council. He took part on technical committees for American Concrete Institute (ACI), Precast/Prestressed Concrete Institute (PCI), American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE), American Bureau of Shipping (ABS), and the International Panel of Experts-Building and Construction Authority of Singapore. In addition, he served as an honorary structural consultant to the Singapore Housing and Development Board (HDB).

He was honored with innumerable awards and recognitions during his long career. He was the first president of the American Concrete Institute, Hawaii Chapter in 1961 and was the first president of SEAOH in 1969. Also in 1969, he has honored as Engineer of the Year by the Hawaii Society of Professional Engineers. He was elected to the National Academy of Engineering (NAE) which honors pioneers in engineering technology. Dr. Yee holds multiple honorary memberships (the highest recognition accorded) to ACI, ASCE, and CCPI. Dr. Yee was honored by the Precast/Prestressed Concrete Institute (PCI); he was awarded the PCI Medal of Honor in 1997 and was named a Titan of the Precast/Prestressed Concrete Industry in 2004. He received Singapore Concrete Institute's Lifetime Achievement Award, and was honored with the HCES Lifetime Achievement Award by the Hawaii Council of



Engineering Societies (HCES).

Dr. Yee followed his passion and pioneered in many aspects. He left his mark throughout the world. He will be remembered and greatly missed



Boosting STEM skills aim of Hawaiian Electric's \$60,000 in donations

In the second quarter of 2017, Hawaiian Electric donated a total of \$60,000 to five nonprofit organizations that are inspiring the next generation of innovators and leaders in science, technology, engineering and math:

- Blue Planet Foundation will use the donation for Project Power Play, a student-driven coding competition to gamify electricity generation and consumption data.




