Hawaiian Electric's Vision for Hawaiii's Energy Future

In Hawai'i's dynamic and changing energy landscape, our companies – Hawaiian Electric, Maui Electric and Hawai'i Electric Light – understand we have a responsibility to adapt. Customers' needs and demands are changing, and we need to respond.

We want to deliver cost-effective, clean, reliable, and innovative energy services to our customers – to create meaningful benefits for Hawaii's economy and environment, making Hawaii a leader in the nation's energy transformation

To do that, we've developed energy plans for Hawai'i's energy future. The plans are about achieving the kind of clean, resilient energy future we all want for our state.

Highlights of the plans, to be achieved by 2030:

Our plan includes actions to deliver lower electric bills over time. It's about expanding customer options - such as community solar, electric vehicles, and pricing options that can help customers lower their bills. It's focused on increasing distributed solar power, like rooftop PV. And it underscores how important it is for us to develop a robust, modern grid that will help us better integrate more renewable resources.

us better integrate more renewable resources.

We expect to achieve the following by 2030:

- More than 65 percent of our energy needs met by renewable energy
- 20 percent reduction in electric bills
- Nearly tripling of the amount of distributed solar power

We'll continue to work with closely with our regulators, the local solar industry, lawmakers, and other energy partners on these plans.

More on rooftop solar

Rooftop solar and other types of distributed generation are a big part of this vision. To support that growth, we're establishing a clear, open planning process to determine how much more distributed solar power can be added each year. And we'll communicate that information, so that customers and solar contractors know what to plan for.

At the same time, we're pursuing new technologies, like energy storage systems and advancements in rooftop PV equipment, so that we help customers add even more PV.

For many months now, Hawaiian Electric has been working closely with the local solar industry on technical solutions to continue to increase rooftop PV. There's tremendous opportunity for more distributed solar power, and it will take everyone working together – utilities, the solar industry, technology partners, and

others - to achieve that potential.

We also think it's the right time to consider changes to the PV rate structure to make it fair to all customers, so that everyone is paying their fair share. Right now, although PV customers continue to remain interconnected to the grid, the costs for maintaining and upgrading the grid are being shifted from them to customers who do not have PV. Hawaiian Electric believes that it's important to have a rate structure where the costs are spread more fairly one that's fair to all customers.

It's important to note that the charges outlined in the plans are strictly hypothetical at this point. While a lot of attention has focused on a new monthly "minimum charge," that charge will ultimately be set in a future regulatory proceeding after the Public Utilities Commission and Consumer Advocate have thoroughly reviewed all costs. What's more, **most cus-**

tomers are already paying more than the proposed minimum charge, so the change shouldn't affect them. And we won't be collecting any additional revenue as a result of this – rather, costs will simply be spread more fairly among customers.

And that's really what the proposed solar rate restructuring is about. It's about how to make the program fair for all customers.

Looking forward

Being so far ahead of the nation on a lot of these issues is a challenge but it's also an opportunity. We have the potential to be a leader in the nation's energy transformation as we work together to create a cleaner and brighter future for Hawai'i.


50TH ANNIVERSARY TRIVIA QUESTION OF THE MONTH


